ABOUT THE OPPORTUNITY

Together for the Common Good (T4CG) is looking for Project Leader to lead the implementation of a 12 month project operating with five Partner organisations in five locations. The role involves coordinating and overseeing the roll out of workshops, the embedding of a delivery capability in the Partners and assisting in the evaluation of the project.

If you are an experienced project manager with excellent communication skills, who gets on with people, who is organised and self-motivated, then this opportunity may be for you. We are keen to appoint someone who can start work as soon as possible after interview.

THE ROLE

Part-time: 22 hours per week, 12 month contract. £17,000 (£28,500 FTE). Working from home, ideally within reasonable travelling time from the project sites. Travel expenses paid. Laptop and systems provided. 4 weeks holiday (pro rata per annum, plus bank holidays) by agreement.

ABOUT T4CG

Together for the Common Good (T4CG) was registered as a charity in March 2017.
