ABOUT THE OPPORTUNITY

We are looking for an efficient all-round WordPress and digital marketing practitioner to assist with tasks associated with the completion of our new website and to improve our online reach. Working on our SEO visibility, the role will optimise and update our existing content, making full use of tagging, Google Analytics and other relevant tools, excellent written English and copy editing skills. Following our brief, the role also includes the formatting of new and some existing content, adhering accurately to our established house style, and repairing broken hyperlinks across the site. This assignment has the potential to transition into a regular part time support role, subject to funding.

THE ROLE

Working remotely. Four week contract. 37.5 hours per week, paid at the London Living Wage. This assignment is also available as a freelance opportunity for an agreed fee.

ABOUT T4CG
