

COMMON GOOD SCHOOLS PROJECT LEADER

JOB DESCRIPTION

Role purpose:

Under the direction of the Head of Operations and Development, to plan and implement the national roll out of the Common Good Schools programme (CGS), and to develop an extension of the programme for 16+ school and youth settings.

Role responsibilities:

- To be T4CG's main point of contact regarding CGS
- To develop an effective and achievable strategy for the roll out of CGS
- To develop appropriate strategic partnerships
- To present and promote the CGS programme amongst school groups, Multi Academy Trusts, local authorities, independent schools, youth settings, and other relevant bodies
- To target and liaise with interested secondary schools, post-16 provision and other appropriate young people's groups
- To introduce the programme to new users, deliver induction training workshops to relevant teaching staff and deliver sample lessons in the classroom where required
- To coach and support staff running CGS, especially in their first year
- To facilitate connections between users and cultivate a peer to peer community of practice
- To maintain open channels of regular communication with colleagues, schools, groups and CGS active partners
- To monitor and evaluate the impact of CGS across all users and to produce an annual impact report
- To make timely, appropriate, improving revisions to the CGS programme

Hours and salary:

4 days (30 hours) per month for 12 months to be worked flexibly. 4 days annual leave (equivalent to four working weeks), plus English Bank and Public Holidays. Work-from-home but role will involve significant travel and meetings away from home as well as online. Some weekend and evening working will be required.

Salary: £8,000 (FTE £40,000) plus expenses. Funding currently in place for 12 months but a longer term post is a realistic possibility. Secondment proposals welcome.

- Discernment on who to liaise with and ability to develop positive working relationships with them
- Understanding of opportunities within non school settings where young people meet
- Knowledge of the curriculum requirements for PSHE, RSE and that of religious education provision required in secondary schools, including SIAMS and the Catholic diocese inspection framework. Experience of OFSTED and SMSC.

- A self-starter and comfortable managing own time
- Resilience and determination in the face of disappointment
- Flexible
- Reflective practitioner
- Passionate about the potential of the Common Good Schools programme
