forming young people

Common Good Schools teaches young people the importance of relationships and responsibility. In unstable times, it positions schools as a force for the common good in the neighbourhood.

Designed for 11-16 year olds, the 10-week programme immerses young people in the Common Good principles through classroom lessons and practical community engagement.

We work on a small scale, prioritising relationships, to develop a range of exemplars. In 2023 we partnered with schools in Leeds, London and West Sussex, including a SEND school.

Our current projections are to scale to a minimum of 20 schools in 2024, including in Liverpool, Hampshire, Bradford, York and further afield.
