
Social Peace Importance of relationship

- ✓ Theology of the Holy Spirit in practice







Subsidiarity - levels of responsibility

Justice: through right relationships and righteousness

- Integral ecology people and planet
- An economy that serves society
- Ecology of daily life rooted in place
- The common good
- Intergenerational justice

To prevent the domination of the human person

Vocational responsibility at multiple levels

- Individual personal responsibility, social dimension of evangelization
- Family building block of society
- Local local institutions and relational power
- Regional decentralised capital and regional institutions
- National maintain a balance of power between state, markets & civil society
- International solidarity through relationships not globalised power
